SCHOOL WIDE POSITIVE BEHAVIOR

School Safety Survey (SSS)

It is time for the annual SSS! Detailed information will be sent to Data Analysts and Principals of SWPBS schools next week. The two week window for the survey will be open **February 3 – February 17**.

Remember, this is an on-line survey that is to be taken by **ALL ADULTS** in the building and **4 students per homeroom in grades 4 and up**. The details for selecting students will be included with info to data analysts and principals.

You must have an 80% participation from these groups in order for the results to be considered valid.

Once the survey is completed, each school will receive detailed results as to how safe the school is perceived to be by both students and staff. It included information on 17 different 'risk factors' relevant to school safety as well as 16 different aspects of the schools 'response plans' for dealing with safety concerns.

This provides some great information to schools as you identify needs and begin planning for the 2012-13 school year!
