How cardinals elect a new pope
Since 1978, Roman Catholic cardinals have chosen popes and followed the following procedure adopted in the 1970s, with some additional rules added by Pope John Paul II.

- 1 Cardinals meet in the Vatican's Sistine Chapel, vote for conclave.**
New Conclave Chamber
- 2 All voters Sistine Chapel. Chamber has been restricted to necessary lighting devices.**
- 3 Two votes. Preliminary to elect John Paul II's rules requiring written ballots, secret instructions.**
Clarifying rules: Cardinals may discuss election rules but not change them. White smoke indicates choice.
- 4 First vote. One ballot taken in afternoon of first day.**
- 5 Deliberation and voting. Cardinal writes ballot on ballot, folds in green to show he is voting, writes name on paper, puts ballot into ballot box, folds into envelope, seals.**
Instructions: show total number of ballots, name on each ballot written down, each count.
- 6 If no person gets two thirds of vote, another ballot taken immediately. If no winner, all ballots and names returned to electors in chapel, checked to make sure no peeking.**
If no winner after three days: Cardinals also voting, hold a day of discussion after every ballot. If inconclusive ballots continue for about 12 days, cardinals may choose to require only temporary majority to win.

Keeping safe at TTU

Take Back the Night (TBN), a worldwide event that promotes the importance of women's safety, was held at Tennessee Technological University on the evening of April 5. Sponsored by the Tech Ladies Coalition and the Commission on the Status of Women, TBN attracted around one-hundred participants from the university and the Cookeville community. The Tech Ladies Coalition, a new student led organization on the TTU campus, initiated this event and received enthusiastic support from the university. The faculty advisors of the group include history professor Dr. Paula Hinton and Cookeville High School graduate and former *Charger* staff member Dr. Lori Maxwell.

The march began at the University Center and made a loop around campus, past fraternity houses and unlit areas that had been noted on previous safety walks. The evening concluded with a candlelight vigil on the quad in front of Derryberry Hall. "The turnout [for TBN] was great and better than we expected," said student organizer Richelle Wardell, adding that she hopes that the university will hold an annual TBN in the future.

This was the first time an official TBN march was held on the TTU campus. For the past three years, the Women's Commission has conducted a safety walk with its members, an event in which they noted unlit and otherwise unsafe areas on the TTU campus. TBN differs in that it focuses directly on awareness of violence against women and includes speeches and educational opportunities. It is also a larger-scale event that involves all people who are concerned about these issues.
